Every term we hold a nursery 'Stay and Play' session. These sessions are lovely opportunities for you to come and work with your child.

Book Club



If your child would like to join our book club they will be able to bring in money (from 10p to £1). This will be transferred into stamps in their special savings card. At the end of each half term, the children will be able to spend their stamps to buy new books at discounted prices. Children will receive fruit and milk on a daily basis.



Preparing and tasting other food and snacks will happen throughout the year as part of the curriculum.

Nursery fund is £1 per week and can be paid on your child's first session of the week. This money will be used for a range of exciting activities throughout the year.

Allergies

All food prepared in nursery is in accordance with food hygiene standards. All potential allergens in regular snacks are documented and recorded on a daily basis.

Please keep staff informed of any other allergy your child may have, (Please do not include foods your child does not like).



Children who attend our 30 hours provision will stay for lunch each day. Your child has the option of staying for a school lunch or bringing a packed lunch.

You will be given menus for the school lunches, where you can select the meals they would like.

The cost of school lunches will be £2.50 per day.

Reports

Each term, there will be opportunity to chat to staff about your child's progress. At the end of their time in nursery, you will receive a written report.

Throughout the year we provide a range of other experiences for your child such as trips, visits and visitors. As well as this, we hold events in school which you will be invited to, such as concerts, and coffee mornings/ afternoons. You will be kept informed of all dates.



Uniform is available to order directly from school. (Please see sheet in pack).

Children wear a red jumper or cardigan, grey skirt or trousers and a white polo shirt.

While in nursery, children may wear black or grey leggings or tracksuit bottoms. This can be helpful particularly if they are still toilet training.

Footwear needs to reflect the weather, as children will be outside in all Seasons.

Items of clothing

Please ensure that your child's name is clearly marked inside their cardigans, sweatshirts and coats etc.





Outdoor Environment

Children have access to the garden every day. Young children especially love to work outside in the wind and rain. Please make sure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather. Wellies, hat, gloves and a scarf for cold weather. Cap or sun hat and sun screen for hot sunny days.

Why is outdoor play so important?

During your child's time in Nursery you may notice that we take the children outside as often as possible.

We feel this is an important part of their nursery experience for the following reasons:

- Many children prefer playing outside and as a result they may show greater levels of concentration and motivation when learning new skills and concepts across the whole curriculum.
- Young children learn by being physically active and the outside environment allows greater

All children aged two to five are working within the national guidance of the new Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. This guidance clearly emphasises the importance of outdoor play. It says the nurseries should:

- Plan a learning environment indoors and outdoors.
- Plan play activities both indoors and outdoors.
- Plan space indoors and outdoors for appropriate challenges.





We aim to offer activities cover all areas of the curriculum that build upon and extend the learning taking place outdoors. For example, If the children have read a story indoors, they may have the chance to act it out using props when outside. If they have been counting groups of objects inside, they could count and compare the number of skittles knocked over outside.

We will endeavour to take the children outdoors as often and possible and in all types of weather. It would be great assistance if you could make sure that your child comes to nursery dressed suitably for the weather conditions each day. We also ask that they wear appropriate footwear and clothing for outdoor activities such as climbing, scrambling, gardening and painting. Donations of outdoor clothing, wellies etc. are gratefully received. Thank you for supporting us with our outdoor play.
